### STUDY PLAN

In general, double degree students take all course work required to obtain both degrees without extending the standard study period of four semesters. Therefore, please make sure to plan your course of studies thoroughly as early as possible (according to the plan below).

You will spend the first and second semester in Mannheim, where you will take the five core courses of the MMM, electives of at least 26 ECTS and a research seminar (7xx module). Please note, that you have to fulfill the requirements for writing a Master Thesis with these courses. More detailed information can be found in the MMM Module Catalog.

During the third semester you will take courses at Queen's University, including four core courses and one elective course. You will also participate in a group business project, which will take place over the entire second year of your studies. During the fourth semester you will write a master thesis under supervision of a chair at the University of Mannheim. Whether the thesis will be written in Mannheim or in Kingston is up to you and your supervisor.

1) Courses can be selected freely from all Business Administration courses within the MMM. The thesis prerequisites must be covered with these Elective Business Courses and with the Seminar.

2) The Team-Based Research Project takes place during the entire second year of the studies. Returning to Queen's for the completion of it is not mandatory. The project can be completed remotely, if desired.

The master thesis is supervised by the University of Mannheim. The thesis supervisor and student will jointly decide whether the thesis will be written in Kingston or in Mannheim.
