STUDY PLAN

In general, double degree students take all course work required to obtain both degrees without extending the standard study period of four semesters. Therefore, please make sure to plan your course of studies thoroughly as early as possible (according to the plan below).

You will spend the first and second semester in Mannheim. More detailed information regarding academic requirements can be found in the MMM Module Catalog.

During the third and fourth semester, you will study at USC in Columbia and take the four core courses of the 'Master of International Business' and choose electives worth 36 ECTS. In the end, you will be taking a minimum of 60 ECTS at both universities. One credit at USC is equivalent to two ECTS at Mannheim.
