The Endowed Chair of Procurement offers three types of Bachelor thesis topics:

- A. Literature review: Summarizing, structuring, and critically reviewing the existing literature on a specific topic.
- B. **Conceptual research**: Developing a framework or model for a specific research question based on a given theory or theories.
- C. **Exploratory empirical research**: Exploring a specific research phenomenon by using literature as well as primary (interviews) and secondary (e.g., databases, internet) data sources.

1. Research Field "Risk and Disruptions"

- Financial distress of suppliers: Causes, management, and consequences [A, C]
- Risks of global sourcing: Offshoring and fluctuating exchange rate risks [A]

- Conflicts in buyer-supplier relationships [A, B, C]

- Supplier innovation: What do we know and what do we need to know? [A]
- Supplier innovation push: Analysis of the determinants influencing supplier's willingness to share innovative ideas with specific customers [A, B, or C]
- New ventures as suppliers to established buying firms [A or C]

4. Research Field "Sustainability"

- Implementing sustainability activities in the upstream supply chain [A or C]
- Management of complexity and traceability to facilitate sustainable sourcing [A or C]
